



What the course will involve -

This course is the equivalent to two A Levels and is studied over two years. Initially you will develop a solid acting technique and apply this to a range of roles both in Contemporary Theatre, Film and TV.

You will also develop skills in Devising Theatre, Script Writing and Improvisation in addition to completing a Theatre in Education project.

You will take part in a range of performances both in college and the wider community. The college has a long history and reputation for its excellent shows, musicals and plays and students on this course will be expected to get fully involved.

Assessment -

All work is teacher assessed and verified both internally and externally.

There are a total of 12 units that must be followed but students have considerable choice in which units can be included in their studies.

What the course can lead to -

Clearly there are many routes that may be of interest to students that could lead directly from this course. These include work in TV, Film and Voice over Work, as well as work in Theatre and Educational Theatre.

This course also lends itself to a variety of other careers that require confident public speaking and acts as a good general qualification for a number of university degrees. Acting is also a good foundation for those considering a career in teaching.
