



## **What the course will involve -**

### **AS Level**

Students investigate two historical periods.

1. Document studies – Nazi Germany 1933-63
2. English History period studies Henry VIII and Wolsey, Henry VIII and Cromwell, Edward VI and Mary I, Religious conflict and change during the Tudor period 1509-55

### **A2 Level**

3. Themes in History – The Catholic Reformation in the 16th Century.
4. Independent Investigation – a historical study of 2,500 words on Roosevelt's America 1917-45 (counts for 15% of course)

## Assessment -

Two modular examinations at the end of Year 12. One modular examination at the end of Year 13. One module in Year 13 will be a coursework based study focusing upon Roosevelt's America 1917-45.

Students do need to read around the subject i.e. other texts and journals e.g. Historical Review.

## What the course can lead to -

Continuing Education - History at degree level, good preparation and skills for English, Law, Sociology, Psychology, Archaeology and Classics.

Careers - Curator, Archivist, Archaeologists, Market Research, Journalism, Teacher, managerial positions, Lawyer.



## Entry Requirements -

A grade C pass or above in GCSE History is essential for entry onto this course. As essays will be the most common means of assessment, competent use of written English is essential. An ability to think for yourself, forming personal judgements, would be desirable.
