# Task 3 How to use an AED.

# Read the information and answer the questions.

AED stands for automated external defibrillator. This is an emergency life-saving device used in the event of sudden cardiac arrest. The device analyses the heart rhythm and administers an electrical charge to the heart if needed to establish a regular heartbeat.

- > Turn the AED on
- ➤ Follow all the AED voice prompts
- ➤ Ensure no one is touching the casualty when it is analysing
- ➤ Ensure no one is touching the casualty before pushing the shock button

# Connecting the AED pads

- > Ensure that the chest is dry
- Consider shaving the chest if it is hairy

- ➤ Use the pre-prepared pads that come with the AED, they are ready to use.
- > Stick the pads onto the chest as indicated on the pads.
- ➤ Ensure each pad is securely attached

# **Public Access Defibrillators**

You can find AEDs in many public places, including: offices, schools, shopping centres, supermarkets and airports. It is important that public places have AEDs because in the event of a cardiac arrest these would need to be accessed quickly; the sooner an AED is attached the sooner it can restart the heart.
