Introduction

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to the school for the purpose of giving our students information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 and the Skills and Post-16 Education Act 2022.

Pupil entitlement

All pupils in years 8 to 13 are entitled to:

- Find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships, through options events, assemblies, group discussions and taster events;
- Understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses available to them.

For pupils of compulsory school age, these encounters are mandatory and there will be a minimum of two encounters for pupils during the 'first key phase' (year 8 to 9) and two encounters for pupils during the 'second key phase' (year 10 to 11). For pupils in the 'third key phase' (year 12 to 13), particularly those that have not yet decided on their next steps, there are two more provider encounters available during this period, which are optional for pupils to attend.

The majority of these provider encounters will be scheduled during the main school hours and the provider will be given a reasonable amount of time to, as a minimum:

- Share information about both the provider and the approved technical education qualification and apprenticeships that the provider offers;
- Explain what career routes those options could lead to;
- Provide insights into what it might be like to learn or train with that provider (including the opportunity to meet staff and pupils from the provider);
- Answer questions from all students, including our most vulnerable and those with additional learning needs.

Meaningful provider encounters

Cowley International College defines one encounter as one meeting/session between pupils and one provider.

As part of our careers programme, we will consider requests from approved training, apprenticeship, technical and vocational education providers, including University Technical Colleges where appropriate, to speak to our students. Cowley International College will also approach these providers directly when planning and organising key careers related events throughout the school year such as school assemblies, webinars within the curriculum, including live events, careers engagement events and parents' evenings.

We are committed to providing meaningful encounters to all pupils using the <u>Making it meaningful</u> <u>checklist.</u>

Meaningful online engagement is also an option, and we are open to providers that can provide live online engagement with our pupils.

The college day runs from 8:55am until 3:05pm.

Management of provider access requests

Procedure

All requests made by providers should be emailed at least six weeks in advance of the expected date of the session. In the first instance, requests by providers should contact Mr Harper, Careers Administrator, via email to careers@cowleysthelens.org.uk.

Granting Requests and Refusal of Requests

Once your request has been submitted, Cowley International College's Careers Leader will respond to you within 10 working days. All requests will be given due consideration by the Careers Leader and Senior Leadership Team.

Once the request has been granted, we will ask you for a range of information to share with our students and parents before the session. This may be a prospectus, letter or presentation to share with students and parents in advance of your session.

This should include:

- Details of the opportunities you offer including technical education, courses and entry requirements;
- What is learning like with your institution?;
- How do you prepare students for their best next step on successful completion of your course/training?;
- Provide examples of linking courses with careers relating to the labour market and recent positive destinations of students who have completed their learning with you.

Requests will be considered against:

- Clashes with other planned activities or visits;
- Interruption to preparation for public or internal examinations;
- Availability of school staff, space and resources to host the session;
- All requests will also be considered in line with the school's Safeguarding Policy. For

 College, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Cowley International College will keep a log of all provider requests for access and the outcomes and record on Compass+ to support the delivery and evaluation of the careers programme.

Opportunities for access

The school offers at least six provider encounters required by law (marked in bold text) and several additional events, integrated into the school careers programme (see table below).

We will offer providers an opportunity to come into school to speak to pupils or their parents or carers.

The Library and Study Area are available to all pupils at lunch and break times.
