Student Spotlight



Three of our Y9 students and aspiring mathematicians have been adding to their learning by attending the Mathematics Education on Merseyside (MEM) Masterclasses.

The students were nominated by the Maths department for their enthusiasm and ability in the subject and, over the past couple of months, they have attended four Masterclasses across the region to enhance their learning.

The sessions included activities on Roman Numerals, origami, pyramid building and fun mathematical puzzles at venues including Liverpool John Moores University and Liverpool Hope Academy.

The students enjoyed the experience, saying: "We really enjoyed the Masterclasses, they were fun and interesting.

"It has helped our understanding of Maths and opened our eyes to see what you can do with Maths in the future."

During the final session, the students received a presentation in one of the university lecture theatres where they collected a certificate, pen and some maths books.
