
### Our mission

# The transition from primary to secondary school



We take particular care to help new students settle quickly into the larger community of a secondary school and we work closely with primary schools throughout the school year to ensure a smooth transition.


All good partnerships need to invest time to develop long-term relationships and we therefore invite all the parents/carers of our new Year 7 students to a special parents' evening at the College during the summer term as well as to a Year 7 Forum that takes place shortly after students start College in September.

To ensure that our new Year 7 students are given an opportunity to familiarise themselves and prepare for secondary school, they are invited to spend three full days at Cowley in the summer term before they join in September.

All new students are also invited into Cowley during August for a brilliant, fun-packed week long summer school that involves fun activities, crafts and team building (as well as meeting their new classmates and some of their teachers). Year 5 students from our feeder primary schools are also invited to Cowley for specially arranged events and taster lessons during the summer term.

Our College Open Evening, early in the autumn term, gives students and parents/ carers alike the opportunity to visit the College and ask any questions they might have.

Once September arrives, we offer a comprehensive induction programme for our Year 7 students to help them to settle into their new College life and to get to know their peers through a variety of activities. We involve older students, who will act as guides and mentors to the new arrivals, making sure that they feel supported and well informed about their new College. The Year 7 pastoral team are always available to support both students and parents/carers throughout what is a significant change in their lives.



### **Guidance and Support**

The main school is organised into a pastoral system for each year group. Each pastoral team is made up of a Head of School (either upper or lower), a Head of Achievement, a Year Co-ordinator and a Team Tutor. In addition to this, we also have two Family Liaison Officers that can work closely with students and families should it be required.

A major strength of the College is the pastoral teams' ability to build positive relationships between the school, the student and their parents/carers. We attribute the quality of the care that we provide to taking the time to get to know each student and their family.

This partnership helps to raise students' expectations and standards of achievement in a caring, secure and supportive environment. The pastoral teams have a very important role in helping students to settle into Cowley.

Students will typically remain with the same Team Tutor until the end of Year 11. This means that throughout their time at College, they will have a regular member of staff to whom they can turn for help and support. In addition to the pastoral teams, Cowley has a Student Support Manager who is on hand daily to assist students and their parents/ carers.

Cowley offers a range of support for students to enable them to access the curriculum. Support includes: a range of daily Team Tutor activities, peer, small group, 1-to-1, mentoring, student reports, behaviour support packages and reading.

Our students' wellbeing and happiness is of paramount importance.

Cowley, in collaboration with Merseyside Safer Schools, operate a 24/7 confidential online reporting system that can be used by students to communicate with key members of staff within the College.

In addition to the daily opportunity to discuss any issues with Team Tutors, students also have the opportunity to talk to our Mental Health & Wellbeing Co-ordinator along with any of our trained Mental Health Champions. We also have access to a number of external agency support from the Mental Health Support Team, Teenage Advice Zone and the Banardos Resilience Team.

### Personalised learning

#### **Higher Achieving Pupils (HAP)**

These learners are identified on a yearly basis by the Head of Achievement and Assistant Headteacher on a permanent basis by various forms of data.

If your daughter/son is identified as a 'High Achieving Pupil', this means they are either already achieving a high level of success or demonstrating potential. We hope they will make good use of the opportunities for challenge in lessons and widen their experience by taking part in the extra-curricular activities.

Although it may be assumed that all high achieving students will achieve success in the education system easily, this is not always the case. Appropriate support of teachers, parents/ carers and peers together is needed.

At Cowley International College, our aim is to ensure the provision of opportunities to boost the attainment, motivation and self-confidence of all students. We provide this in a number of ways:

- Differentiated lessons
- Extra-curricular activities
- Educational opportunities, visits and trips

We are dedicated to ensuring that all students achieve their challenging targets. However, we recognise that some students have exceptional potential and benefit from additional input to ensure they aware of their potential and the opportunities that potential offers. At Cowley International College, HAP students are offered a wealth of extra-curricular opportunities. Students are surveyed to find their needs and interests and, in recent years, this has resulted in visits to The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge; debates run by sixth form students; specialist sessions delivered by college lecturers on "How to get into Medical School"; "Forensic Psychology" and "Medical Mavericks".

#### The 'Climb to 9' programme

Additionally, HAP students have the opportunity to partake in the 'Climb to 9' enrichment programme.

Students are exposed to a range of core and none core subjects. This is a bespoke

programme specifically designed to enrich and extend the educational experience and outcomes of our more able learners, ensuring they make outstanding progress and broaden their cultural capital.

#### Climb to 9 at KS3

Beginning in Year 6, the brightest students in each of our feeder primaries partake in enrichment activities designed to stretch and challenge them. They also have the opportunity to complete a summer project that includes challenging but enjoyable English, Mathematics, History and Geography activities.

In Year 7, the high achieving cohort is identified in September using end of Key Stage 2 SATs and CAT data. From this point, they are offered intellectual extra-curricular and enrichment activities, alongside tailored and accelerated learning to ensure their education is suited to their needs and abilities, allowing them to fulfil their true potential. They will partake in 6 x 6 week projects for one hour per week after college hours. Projects are something new and different with an outcome linked to mastering a skill(s) linked to KS4. Each non-core department will deliver a project, one cycle per two academic years.

#### Climb to 9 at KS4

At the end of Year 9, our high achieving cohort is reviewed in order to establish our KS4 'Climb to 9' cohort. Those are the students who are predicted the highest grades at GCSE/Vocational learning.

The purpose of the 'Climb to 9' cohort at this point is to raise pupils' aspirations and to fuel their determination to succeed to the best of their ability. It shows students that their teachers have the confidence in them to attain the highest GCSE grades.

In Year 10, students partake in 3 x 12 week projects for one hour per week after school. The focus will be CORE subjects (English, Maths and Science). Project outcomes link to mastering grade 9 skills linked to KS4 exams. At least one lesson per cycle will be a KS5 taster, workshop with links to industry or demonstrating career pathways. In Year 11, weekly mentor meetings allow these like-minded students to share revision tips, exchange ideas and dispel worries.

As teachers, we want to ensure our higher achieving pupils fulfil their academic potential and that they are afforded the very best opportunities; we strive to provide this through a robust curriculum and an extensive enrichment programme.

#### The Most Able at KS5

For the most academically able progressing from GCSE to post-16 study, Cowley Sixth Form College offers the Cowley Scholars Programme, a bespoke academic programme for the most able of our intake, preparing them for the most competitive of universities and courses. In addition, our Cowley Honours Programme is specifically designed to stretch and challenge those who flourish and exceed expectations.

#### **Raising achievement**

Meeting the needs of our students is a top priority for the College and we have a dedicated Student Support team who work closely with Learning Support Assistants and Year Co-ordinators to provide support for students with physical, learning or behavioural needs.

#### Homework club

A homework club is available to all students after College, Monday - Thursday, and transport is available to take students home afterwards. The club provides a safe learning environment with access to resources and staff on hand to assist.

#### Curriculum pathways

At Key Stage 3, all students study English, Mathematics, Science, Design and Technology, Computing, History, Geography, Religious Education, a Modern Foreign Language, Art, Music, Physical Education, Personal and Social Education and Citizenship.

In Years 7 and 8, some students will have the opportunity to study Mandarin as part of the Mandarin Excellence Programme. In Year 9, students are able to choose to focus their curriculum to some extent, as part of their broader Key Stage 3 programme. In practice, this means that students at the end of Year 8 nominate certain subject areas in which they would like to extend their studies. For instance, in addition to KS3 Geography and History, students in Year 9 are able to choose to study either Geography or History in greater depth.

Students opt formally for their KS4 courses at the end of Year 9. Students have the opportunity to choose from a range of academic and vocational courses to study alongside the core curriculum.

Each student is assigned to a 'Pathway' so that the combination of courses that they study will be appropriate for them. Additionally, students in all pathways have almost identical subject choices during the options process to ensure fairness to all involved.

#### SEND

Cowley International College's core values and ethos is to raise attainment of every young person. Our central belief is that every young person has the opportunity to reach their full potential and have their individual needs catered for, including those pupils with SEND.

The College believes that all young persons should be valued equally. We strive to eliminate prejudice and discrimination. We work to develop an environment where all can flourish and feel safe and all young persons can experience success.

The College is committed to inclusion. We aim to engender a sense of community and belonging, and to offer new opportunities to learners who may have experienced previous difficulties and support, and to those who may experience barriers in their learning in their future.

Staff at Cowley International College are committed to providing an inclusive education for all and are dedicated to reviewing and pursuing new provisions.

The SEND department plays an integral role across the whole College and works tirelessly to keep our young people at the centre of what we do. The department is committed to regular CPD and uses the College website SEND page and Twitter page (@**sendcic**) to keep students and parents involved and updated with new resources and support from external agencies as well as celebrating what our students achieve in and out of College.

### A College with state-of-the-art facilities



The College is equipped with the latest technology that promotes active engagement to encourage personalised teaching and learning.

Students have access to stateof-the art facilities, including well-resourced libraries, music studios and Apple Mac suites and five 3D printers. In addition, students have access to mobile technologies such as iPads and tablets and these are used during lessons to help to stimulate and inspire our students.

The College also has a floodlit 3G pitch that ensures lessons and club matches can take place regardless of the weather conditions.





### The Mandarin Excellence Programme



In 2017, Cowley became one of the first schools in the country to be part of the British Council's flagship Mandarin Excellence Programme and now offers Mandarin to students in Years 7 - 9 (KS3), to Years 10 and 11 (GCSE) and in the Sixth Form (HSK 1 - 5).

The Mandarin Excellence Programme aims to increase the number of UK students studying Mandarin Chinese and to deliver a minimum of 5,000 new UK speakers of Mandarin with a high level of fluency.

Mandarin is a widely spoken and important language of the world, especially in the business world, and is seen as an important language for young people to master to give them more opportunities when seeking jobs in the future.

Around 40 Year 7 students at Cowley will once again this year be offered the chance to study Mandarin. This is an exciting opportunity for all those involved.

In July 2019, our Year 8 Mandarin students, after studying Mandarin Chinese for two years, went to Shanghai on a trip of a lifetime. They developed their Mandarin Chinese language skills at the Shanghai Foreign Language School, as well as getting to explore top attractions and embrace the culture.

Now that the Covid restrictions seem to be coming to an end, we hope to be able to take students to China on similar study trips to experience first-hand the language and culture of China.

### Sporting opportunities



Cowley has a strong reputation and tradition for international sporting tours including visits to Africa, America, Asia, Australasia and Europe.

As well as providing a sportsrich timetable Monday to Friday, the College playing fields on a Saturday morning are a hive of activity with sporting fixtures. We strongly encourage family and friends of team members to come along and support our teams.

Cowley regularly competes against other schools in the following: football, volleyball, badminton, hockey, rugby union, rugby league, girls' football, table tennis, boccia, girls' rugby, netball, athletics, rounders, cricket and baseball. Although we strongly believe in competition, we have a range of activities aimed at improving students' participation in sport and physical activity.

We provide opportunities for students to participate in noncompetitive activities including: dance, gymnastics, aerobics, trampolining, running, kayaking, weight training, wall climbing and golf.

At Cowley, we believe in providing a broad range of sport and physical activities that are accessible to every student.

For those with a sporting talent who attend Cowley Sixth Form, we offer a unique opportunity for students to complete studies and to train and play with St Helens RLFC as part of the Saints Academy Development Programme.

Last year, our senior rugby league team, Cowley Saints, were crowned champions of the North West Division of the College Rugby League, with an unbeaten record.

In addition, each of our rugby teams from Years 7-11 qualified to represent St Helens in the National Champions Schools Cup.

### Our partnership with St Helens RLFC



Saints relocated their training ground to Cowley over a decade ago as part of a ground-breaking partnership between two widely recognised educational and sporting establishments. Players have worked alongside teaching staff to create fun, educational projects that are designed to enhance learning.

The partnership works in a reciprocal manner to support each other's needs – educational initiatives and strategies involve Saints personnel who in turn help to increase the success and achievement of Cowley students.

Saints are also involved in College initiatives to encourage positive student behaviour and learning.

#### About the Saints Academy Development Programme

The Saints Academy Development Programme provides an exciting opportunity for talented sporting school leavers who wish to continue their education at Cowley Sixth Form.

The programme provides the perfect mix of qualifications combined with professional training and the chance to play in competitive games at one of the most famous Rugby League clubs in the world.

Cowley offers a tremendous range of academic, cultural, sporting and other challenging enrichment activities.


Whether sporting, amateur dramatics, adrenaline pumping or mind boggling, Cowley has something on offer for all interests and levels.

With over 35 A-Level, BTEC and Applied Diploma subjects to choose from, Cowley Sixth Form College offers a wide range of progression opportunities to post-16 students of all abilities.

The most recent additions to our curriculum include: Creative Digital Media, A-Level Politics and of course, our popular Nursing Cadetship Programme.
