Aim: To raise attainment, achievement and aspirations of Disadvantaged and Catch Up Premium students





#### Introduction:

#### The Pupil Premium Grant provides funding for two policies:

- raising the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities to reach their potential
- supporting children and young people with parents in the regular armed forces

#### Secondary schools receive:

- £935 for every child in years 7-11 recorded as Ever 6 FSM (Students have received free school meals in the last 6 years)
- £1900 for every Looked after children (LAC) defined in Children Act 1989 as one who is in the care of, or provided with accommodation by, an English local authority
- £1900 for every child who has ceased to be looked after by a local authority in England and Wales because of adoption, a special guardianship order, a child arrangements order or a residence order
- £300 for pupils in year 7 to year 11 recorded as Ever 6 service child or in receipt of child pension from the Ministry of Defence

#### The grant may be spent by schools in the following ways:

- for the purposes of the school, that is for the educational benefit of pupils registered at that school
- for the benefit of pupils registered at other maintained schools or academies
- on community facilities; for example, services whose provision furthers any charitable purpose for the benefit of pupils at the school or their families, or people who live or work in the locality in which the school is situated

#### The Catch-up Premium for Y7

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives state-funded schools, including special schools and alternative provision settings, additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2).

The grant may be spent by schools in many ways during year 7 to enable the students to 'catch-up' to their peers. The DFE gives examples of strategies:

- individual tuition
- intensive small-group tuition
- external services and materials
- summer schools that help students catch up over a short period of time


Pupil Premium Plan 2019-20



### Reviewing progress and impact:

Progress of disadvantaged students is a priority for all staff and it is a common thread in all monitoring and evaluation procedures. The Pupil Premium Strategy Group meet after each data collection point to review progress of disadvantage students and the impact of the interventions taking place. Periodically there is an external review from a trained OfSTED inspector, with the next review taking place during the spring term.
