On Friday, 17th March, fifty-five students and four teachers from Porsche Gymnasium in Stuttgart made their annual trip to St Helens and spent the full day at Cowley for a packed schedule of arts, music and languages.

As part of the visit to Cowley, their students joined our Year 8s, who offered a very warm Cowley welcome, to take part in some great Music, Art and MFL sessions. A teacher from Porsche Gymnasium gave a masterclass to Cowley Sixth Form College's German A-level students.

Miss Mitchell, teacher of German said: "It was a pleasure to welcome and host our friends from Stuttgart on what has been an action-packed day. This is a real highlight of the college year and allows our students to practise their language skills in a real-life setting in addition to our students learning more about the cultural aspects of life in Germany."

After their visit to Cowley, students headed off to the World of Glass. The day finished with a tour of the Saints ground before watching their victory over Hull.



St Helens' relationship with Stuttgart dates back to just after the Second World War and is believed to be one of the oldest twinning partnerships in Europe.

and a number of performing arts students will be heading to Stuttgart later this year to perform.













GREAT SUCCESS IN THE INTERMEDIATE MATHS CHALLENGE

At the beginning of February, a selection of Cowley students from Years 9, 10 and 11 took part in a UK Mathematics Trust Intermediate Maths Challenge.

The Intermediate Maths Challenge is a 60-minute, multiple-choice Challenge which is carried out under examination conditions.

The problems on the challenge are designed to make students think, encouraging mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems.

The challenge was, as ever, a difficult one, but the Cowleians who took part produced an excellent set of results with an impressive total of 34 medalists, 10 higher than last year's haul of 24, and the highest figure the College has achieved for nine years.

Four students achieved gold medals, ten students silver while a further twenty were rewarded with bronze medals. Our highest scorer earned a place in the Pink Kangaroo, an even more challenging follow-on round of the Maths Challenge.

The students have all received a certificate for their achievements. We'd like to congratulate all the students who participated; we're incredibly proud of you.
