
Ed also toured the school, visiting classrooms while lessons were underway.

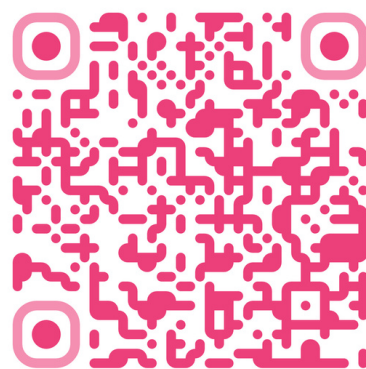
